#ShakeItOut -Suffolk Recycles

The #ShakeItOut campaign has been launched by the Suffolk Waste Partnership to encourage households in Suffolk to help improve recycling rates across the county by making sure black bin bags and other plastic sacks are not thrown in with recyclable materials.

The Partnership, made up of the county, district and borough councils in Suffolk, says more than a quarter (26%) of the materials in Suffolk's recycling bins in 2022/23 were not able to be processed as they were spoiled. Items that contributed to spoiled recycling collections included:

- * Materials that were not clean and dry, or contained food and drink residue

- * Rubbish sacks or plastic bags containing recycling
- * Non-recyclable items, such as nappies and food waste

Plastic bags and rubbish sacks are a particular problem – recycling handlers can't see what's inside them and they are often full of rubbish or other non-recyclable items.

The GLI Group are East Suffolk Council's New Administration

At May's Full Council, elected members voted to install the GLI Group as the new administration of East Suffolk Council, replacing the previous Conservative majority. Councillor Caroline Topping was voted in as the new Leader of East Suffolk Council, becoming East Suffolk Council's first female Leader. The GLI The Green, Liberal Democrat and Independent Councillors on East Suffolk Council formed a cross-party group called the 'GLI' Group after officially adopting an agreement on 16 May.

The Group's Leader, Beccles and Worlingham Councillor Caroline Topping, is now Leader of the Council and said: "I am pleased and humbled that they have elected me as the Leader of East Suffolk Council. In that role I would like to welcome all 55 Members who have been elected to represent our communities at East Suffolk Council".

MALCOLM'S TALK

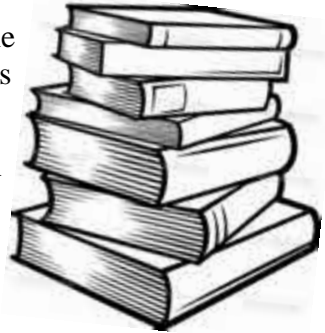

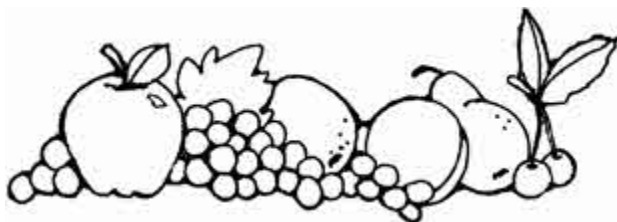

Have you come across the Merlin bird identification app for your phone? It is published by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology and includes a Sound ID tool. Press <record> and it will listen and identify bird song. It could easily become a new obsession - I have only once hung out of the bedroom window at 4am! Record for a minute or so and it will easily collect 8 or 10 different species in full voice. Give it a try to learn your Blackcap from your Blackbird. I was pleased it picked out Goldcrest, Goldfinch, Marsh Tit and Whitethroat along with the usual farmland suspects of Chaffinch, Chiffchaff, Linnet and Yellowhammer and, of course, the Song Thrush, Wren and Dunnock. 25 and counting... We hope you are enjoying this lovely hot summer weather but a reminder to shut your windows when you go out and use security locks for your safety. I have had a number of reports of suspicious behaviour in local villages.

Boundary Fencing

So we have no more worries from people in adjoining property, a reminder that by law it is the landowner's responsibility to secure the fencing, not the person whose animals are grazing in the fields.

Dog Barking Nuisance

I have received reports of a public nuisance being caused in Low Street by continuous barking. If I have any more reports, I will have no hesitation to report it.

It is unfair to others whose lives are disturbed by the noise. Please keep your dogs inside and, if this is what happens when you are out at work, consider that they become bored and anxious when left on their own.

Parking in Low Street

Please consider the safety of other road users when parking your car. Do not park cars on blind bends or too near the junction with the A1120. It is very dangerous for vehicles turning into Low Street and vice versa. Consider that some are larger vehicles such as lorries and tractors and trailers, who are forced onto the other side of road through others' inconsiderate parking. Vehicle registration numbers will be reported.

Availability of Lay-bys

Lay-bys on the A1120 are for public use by passing vehicles and cones and bollards should not be used to prevent others from parking. Please do not put them out.

Stolen Postbox

Framlingham police are appealing for witnesses to come forward with any information about the postbox which was stolen from Pound Green Corner on May 10th 2023. Reference No. 37/27089/29 – Call the Police on 101.

Police Arrests

Vehicles identified as being involved in criminality were checked outside Sainsburys in Ipswich. The operation was carried out by officers from six different teams including the Commercial Vehicle and Modern Slavery teams. 106 vehicles were escorted to the Hadleigh Road car park with just 8 leaving clear of any offences. A 20 year old man was arrested on suspicion of being an

illegal entrant to the UK and was transferred to the custody of Immigration Enforcement A 32 year old man was arrested on suspicion of drug driving and transferred to the Police Investigation Centre.

Fires Costs

The cost of farm and heath fires has rocketed - £21.5m in East Anglia. Rubbish dropped or thrown from vehicles can soon catch fire in dry conditions. Some year ago, we had experience of a field fire. It burnt half the meadow and we had to call out the Fire Brigade after we tried unsuccessfully, as a family, to bring it under control.

Crime Prevention

As with all types of crime, prevention is much better than a cure. Taking simple measures such as these can significantly reduce your chances of being burgled:

- ÿ Locked windows
- ÿ Doors double or dead-locked
- ÿ Interior lights on a timer
- ÿ Exterior lights on a sensor
- ÿ Ask neighbours to keep watch

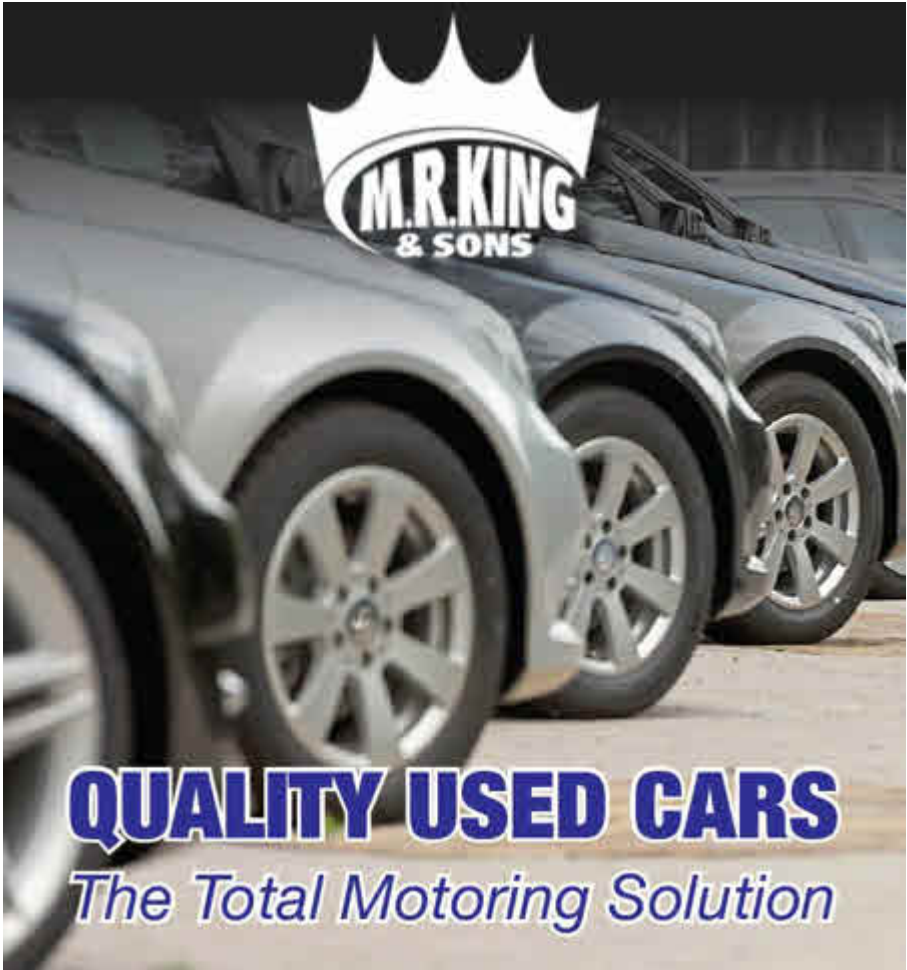
