Over the last couple of weeks (thank you to those who have gone to the meetings) the Community Council, the Parish Council, the Café, Enterprise Badingham and residents of Badingham have been putting together plans for the Jubilee celebrations. I hope everyone will take this opportunity to come along, join in and have fun celebrating 70 years of the Queen's reign.

## **Beacon Lighting**

### Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> June at Colston Hall at 9pm

70 years ago, a beacon was lit at Colston Hall to celebrate the Coronation of the young Queen Elizabeth II. At 9.30pm a beacon will be lit once more to celebrate her 70-year reign. Surely, back then no one could have possibly imagined that 70 years later we would be celebrating a Platinum Jubilee.

Taking place on the same field margin as before, there will be the Royal Proclamation, a Loyal Toast (drink provided), a Prayer for Suffolk and the flying of the Suffolk Flag.

There will be parking, kindly provided by John Bellefontaine, but please walk if you can. A few reserved spaces will be available for those with limited mobility, so they can be parked nearer. If you require one of these spaces please get in touch on 638453.

#### **A Historical Memory**

I am old enough to remember the big Coronation Celebrations we had in Badingham in 1952. Held at Colston Hall, it was a terrible wet and miserable day but, adults and children alike, just got on with it. The final event was the lighting of the beacon, which was a massive bonfire. After dark everybody gathered round and the fire was lit. Well, they tried many times to light it, no success. Everybody gradually drifted off home, AND YES, by midnight the beacon came to life, all on its own, and Badingham skies were well lit up. I went in the morning with my Dad to help clear up and all there was left was a heap of ash!

The site of this year's Platinum Jubilee beacon is about 50 yards away from the original coronation beacon, on the opposite side of the road.



### **'Treebilee'** - a new oak planted in the churchyard

2022 heralds a year-long Platinum Jubilee celebration throughout the United Kingdom, the Commonwealth and around the world, as communities come together to celebrate Her Majesty the Queen's glorious and unprecedented 70-year reign.

A major part of the celebration is the creation of living and lasting memorials, courtesy of a project launched by HRH Prince Charles, affectionately called 'Treebilee', where people across the UK are being urged to plant trees to mark this special occasion.

Badingham Parish Council has elected to take part in this project and has been gifted one of 200 English oak trees by East Suffolk Council. It was planted in the Churchyard by Bob Foster in February 2022, and he had kindly made an excellent metal frame to protect it from wildlife.

Tree planting is an important way to help tackle climate change, so this is a great opportunity to contribute to a practical environmental project, creating a lasting legacy. Symbolising royalty, patriotism and strength, the English Oak tree has made an enormous historical contribution to landscape, biodiversity, culture and economy.

Oaks grow to an average of 20m in height and a mature oak can host up to 5,000 different species of invertebrate that will form the basis for a healthy food chain that benefits birds and mammals. As the tree grows and ages, it will develop cavities, crevices, dead wood and other features that plants and animals love.

Trees also naturally absorb CO2, a key greenhouse gas, through the process of photosynthesis, helping to create a significant carbon sink, to benefit everyone through a natural process.

When oaks reach 400 years old, they are considered ancient trees; some can live for over 1,000 years. A small dedication ceremony will take place on Sunday 5th June, following the 11am Church Service, when a plaque will be put in place.





#### Dr Dan Poulter MP Member of Parliament for Central Suffolk and North Ipswich



The Covid pandemic has disrupted international supply lines for many of the goods and services that we previously took for granted, the consequence being an increase in inflation, which drives up the cost of living.

This challenge is now further compounded by war in the Ukraine and whilst our thoughts are quite rightly with the people of Ukraine, we must also recognise the need for the UK to become more self-sufficient in the future, and less reliant on imported goods - particularly food and energy.

Ukraine was the biggest international producer of fertiliser and the biggest exporter of wheat. As a result of the war, there has been considerable disruption to supplies, leading to increases in the cost of many food stuffs in our shops, such as bread and breakfast cereals.

Looking ahead, we simply must produce more of our own food. By protecting and supporting our farmers and food producers, we also protect consumers by keeping food prices in the shops lower in the long run.

Here in Suffolk, our farmers stand ready to rise to the challenge of producing more locally-grown food, but we must also look to support them better. We've heard from our farming leaders that they are concerned about "crippling" labour shortages and I'd like to see the Government look at improving current immigration policies, as well as at the Skilled Workers Visa scheme, to try and help tackle this issue.

We also need to step down our reliance on an overseas workforce to plug our seasonal workforce gap. To achieve this, we need to develop homegrown talent - make the sector appealing to work in, develop a greater vocational offer and bring forward and support our next generation of farmers and food producers. Where appropriate, I would also like to see greater support become available, allowing our farmers to diversify and support the appropriate roll-out of solar energy, whilst simultaneously recognising the need to protect our precious inappropriate farmland from housing development.

We need to start protecting and supporting our own food producers. We need to start listening more to our farmers and, where is practicably reasonable, better protect farming land for food production.

The war in the Ukraine has brought much into perspective - the importance of protecting freedom of speech, the importance of improving our energy security, and the importance of increasing our food security. If we want to keep food prices in the shops down in the long run, perhaps it is time we thought not just in terms of fair-trade shopping, but of supporting local. It is only through supporting our local farmers and food producers that we will help to keep prices down for consumers and hardpressed families.
