*** NEWS FROM BADINGHAM PARISH COUNCIL ***

The next PC Meeting dates: Please note we have tweaked the frequency of Parish Council meetings to try and include as many Members as possible to those meetings, juggling days and dates due to work commitments and so on. By the time you read this we will have had the regular meeting on 23 March. The next meeting is on Tuesday 16 May at 7pm in the main hall. This will be the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council (AGM), when all elected members take up their new position and posts, with a number of set procedures to be followed at this meeting.

It will be preceded by the Annual Meeting of the Parish (APM) at 6pm, again in the main hall. This is an opportunity for all the various clubs and groups in the village, including the PC, to present an annual report to the village. Attendance is open to all parishioners. It is not a Parish Council meeting. **Do come and learn about what has been happening in Badingham over the last year**. We will also be inviting the owners of the pub to give us a brief update. All clubs are invited to attend the APM and will receive an email invitation to present a report.

Local Elections 4 May 2023: Please remember that you MUST bring voter ID with you when casting your vote in the Village Hall on 4 May. See page 20 confirming what are acceptable forms of ID.

We are also looking for new Parish Councillors. Regrettably long standing member and previous Chair, Sonia Frost, is hanging up her hat and will not be standing for re-election. After over 20 years on the Parish Council, she feels, quite rightly, that she has done her bit! We wish her well and would like to publicly express our thanks for the dedication and time she has committed to the PC over those many years. Thank you Sonia, your insights will be sorely missed.

And so we need **YOU** to take up the mantle and become a Parish Councillor as this leaves us precariously lacking in Councillors. We have several vacancies for which members can be co-opted at the May meeting if we do not receive any further nominations as decided by the local elections on 4 May. Please speak to an existing Parish Councillor or the Clerk for further information.

King Charles' Coronation: With so few Parish Councillors, the PC felt it does not have the manpower to stage any celebrations for the above event. Instead we will be planting a tree in the Churchyard to commemorate this auspicious occasion with a suitable plaque.

Thermal Imaging Project: This has been cancelled due to the very limited uptake and the extensive training that would have required by our two volunteers. Prorate, it was agreed it was not worth spending time on. Thermal imaging apps are available for smart phones for anyone still interested in scanning their home.

Pete's Pond

As many of you know, this pond is a very special place for the Rous family.

We have been delighted to share it with locals but it must be understood that it is on private land and access to it comes with conditions. These revolve around respect – for the place itself, others who use it and most importantly the wildlife. We really appreciate the way that there has been "self-policing" over the years but just recently we have had cause to be concerned at some changes. We are finding rubbish lying around, dog poo bags have been left hanging on a hedge, a permissive footpath marker removed and a notice requesting that one side of the pond be left for wildlife has been destroyed. We have received a grant to restore the hedge but this itself comes with conditions that the restoration encourages wild life and we do notice that there are fewer nesting birds around the pond than we would expect. We could prevent access all around it but it seemed reasonable to have one side left undisturbed allowing a permissive path along the Southern side.

So please can we count on your support and help in keeping Pete's Pond special.

I asked Paul's advice on a large, unfamiliar bug that I found clinging to a bedroom curtain on the night of the power cuts. It had presumably squeezed indoors out of the windy weather. Paul identified the photo as a Western Conifer Seed Bug. It is described as a large, reddish-brown squashbug that can reach 2cm (¾in) in length. The bug is native to North America and was first reported in Italy in the late 1990s, reached Britain in 2007 and is becoming widespread in England and Wales. It feeds on the sap of pines, especially the seed cones, so I would probably have been quite safe even if I hadn't decided to throw it out the window!

Don't forget that Enterprise Badingham are collecting a list of wildlife seen in the churchyard and around the Community Gardens. They would welcome your contributions.

LAWNMOWER THEFT

A 4-wheeled Bateson car trailer and orange Kabuta ride-on mower were among the items stolen after thieves raided a barn in a village near Halesworth on Friday, 6th January between 3.30pm and 7am the next day. Also stolen were Draper Oil Free 25I and Storm Force 50I compressors. Please be mindful of these burglars and make sure all sheds are locked up, have a security light and keys removed from vehicles. DANGEROUS VAPES

More than 350 dangerous vapes have been seized locally. These vapes did not meet legal standards, often containing high levels of nicotine, contaminants or banned ingredients. You need to purchase from a reputable retailer and question strange looking packaging. Vapes should never be used by children, who are more susceptible to becoming addicted to nicotine which can cause damage to brains and lungs.

The Government recognises vapes are the number one tool in helping smokers quit effectively. My own thought is I gave up smoking many years ago with no vapes. I gave it up for Lent and never looked back. What do you think? Let me know your views.

HACKED BANK ACCOUNT

A warning to people doing online banking. Today I have heard that money had been taken out of someone's account; although assured this shouldn't happen because of security measures. The Barclaycard and debit card have been changed.

HATE CRIME

These acts of violent behaviour or hostility are usually motivated by hatred of a person's race, religion, disability, gender identity or sexual orientation. If you have had any problems, you can give information anonymously to Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111.

We are fortunate not to have these problems in Badingham, as far as I know. We have a wonderful village with lovely people and I would be surprised if I heard anything so unkind.

BRING PHOTO ID TO VOTE

You can use any of the following accepted forms of photo ID when voting at a polling station.

International travel

Passport issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, an EEA state or a Commonwealth country

Driving and Parking

- Driving licence issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, or an EEA state (this includes a provisional driving licence)
- · A Blue Badge

Local travel

- · Older Person's Bus Pass funded by the Government of the United Kingdom
- Disabled Person's Bus Pass funded by the Government of the United Kingdom
- Oyster 60+ Card funded by the Government of the United Kingdom
- Freedom Pass

Proof of age

· Identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (a PASS card)

Other government issued documents

- · Biometric immigration document
- Ministry of Defence Form 90 (Defence Identity Card)
- · National identity card issued by an EEA state
- · Electoral Identity Card issued in Northern Ireland
- Voter Authority Certificate
- · Anonymous Elector's Document

You will only need to show one form of photo ID. It needs to be the original version and not a photocopy.

You can apply for a FREE voter ID document, known as a Voter Authority Certificate. if:

- you don't have an accepted form of photo ID
- you're not sure whether your photo ID still looks like you
- · you're worried about using an existing form of ID for any other reason, such as the use of a gender marker

You need to register to vote before applying for a Voter Authority Certificate. The deadline in the elections on 4 May 2023 is 11:59 pm on Monday 17 April.

THE SLOW READERS BOOK CLUB



I have long championed the need for brownfield development to be prioritised ahead of building on our precious Suffolk countryside and for planning decisions about new housing developments to be taken with our local communities at their heart.

It is because of my belief in protecting the countryside from over-development that a few years ago, I worked with other MPs to block suggested changes to the planning system. These changes would have potentially reintroduced a form of regionally set housing targets by the back door, as well as fast-tracked developments without proper local consultation or scrutiny. These changes were wrong and I am pleased to have played my part in stopping them.

However, the Levelling Up and Regeneration Bill, currently going through Parliament is different. The Government has listened to my views and is now set to reform the planning framework that will benefit local communities here in Suffolk.

A key part of the reforms will see a new development plan system put in place at a local level, meaning that plans decided by local communities will be given much higher priority, with a presumption that the local plan must be followed unless there is a very strong reason to override it. This is a significant step forward given the amount of work that goes on in our local communities to inform local plans. I am also especially encouraged to see the introduction of a "use it or lose it" clause, which will prevent developers from stockpiling land and gaming the system. In future developers will lose

their planning consent unless they proceed to develop the site in a timely manner.

Suffolk's towns and parishes already have the power to develop their own neighbourhood plans. Thanks to these important reforms, top-down regional housing targets will be a thing of the past, and Whitehall civil servants, many of whom have never set foot in Suffolk, will lose the power to impose massive new housing developments on our area.

These new reforms will also help to increase the accessibility of neighbourhood planning by allowing Parish Councils to produce simpler, easier to produce 'neighbourhood priorities statements', which will undoubtedly be welcome news to our hardworking local Parish Councils.

Whilst I welcome these positive reforms, I am continuing to fight for new laws to allow a community right of appeal against a planning decision. Currently, developers have the right to appeal but communities do not. It is time to level the playing field. Bad planning decisions need to be challenged, and residents deserve the right to do so.

Finally, I am pleased to see that under the proposed reforms, new Local Plan Commissioners will be introduced to support or, if councils fail in their statutory duties, to take over plan-making, in tandem with a new set of measures to increase the effectiveness of planning enforcement.

These new planning reforms are an important step in the right direction, and I shall continue to do all that I can as an MP to ensure our local councils have better tools to make the right planning decisions in the future.
