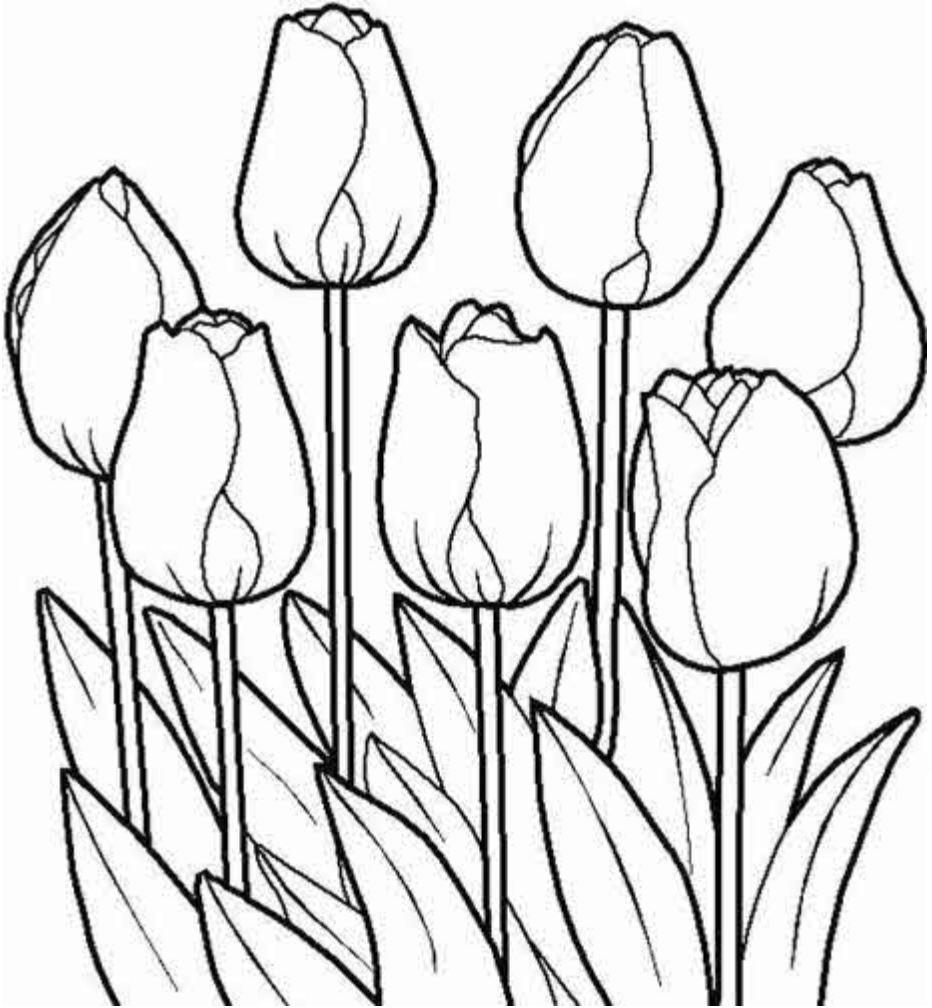

Thank you to Meg Knott for the loan of her pictures which are displayed in the hall. If any other local artists would like to do the same it would be great. They could be up for sale or just to brighten up the hall and share work. It looks like there might be interest in a regular Art class so watch this space later in the year.

We are now planning for a range of improvements over the coming year, both outside and inside the hall, with support from the National Lottery. The next activities will be focused on getting the community herb garden going – supported by East Suffolk Council.

Do be careful and **DON'T TAKE DRUGS**. Sgt Julian Ditcham of the Roads and Armed Policing Team says they continue these operations on the roadside to stop vehicles suspected of an offence. Don't get caught out with drugs in your system and make sure your vehicle is road-worthy, taxed and insured.

I am pleased to say I haven't heard of any recent break-ins around Badingham. Thank you all for reports which have included Footpaths, Rogue Traders, Flooding on the A1120 and by the White Horse, mud and continued flooding over the bridge on Wood Road – and, of course, potholes. Reports came through of a suspicious grey car. Most are being sorted and some are on-going. We'll get there in the end.

Drug Driving

There have been so many accidents due to drug taking including a recent accident at Yoxford. The police are now testing for this at the roadside. They can stop you and conduct a test if they think you have taken drugs or you've committed a traffic offence or you've been involved in a road traffic collision. It may mean a hefty fine or imprisonment and an automatic driving ban. Also consider other problems you may face including an endorsement on your licence for 11 years, increased insurance premiums, problems if you drive for work and trouble travelling to countries like the USA.

Public Footpath

The footpath sign opposite Gortons Cottages on High Road has been removed. If anyone knows the whereabouts of this sign, please can you get in touch with me before the council organise a replacement.

Home Office Funding

Funding of £991,023 was conditional on partner contributions of 50% of the amount granted. Match funding of £706,649 has been generated through a contribution from the Pooled Business Rate fund of £150k and in a kind contribution from each local authority, Suffolk County Council, Suffolk Constabulary and the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner.

**MAKE A CHANGE –
BECOME A COUNCILLOR**

Local councils can only be as helpful, connected and energetic as the people elected to run them, so we need councillors capable, enthusiastic and engaged to reflect their communities.

WHAT DO LOCAL COUNCILS DO?

Badingham Parish Council has overall responsibility for the well-being of our local community. Their work falls into three main categories:

- Delivery of services
- Improve quality of life for residents
- Give communities a democratic voice

Local councils run numerous services, depending on the size of the council. As we are just a small rural village, our services are limited but include managing open spaces including Pocket Park, ensuring footpaths are maintained by Public Rights of Way (PROW), public seating and litter and dog bins, the Village Sign, the bus shelter and the Village Hall.

BECOMING A LOCAL COUNCILLOR

As a local councillor you can become a voice for your community and make real change. Local councillors are the champions of their community who invest time in local projects and issues to the benefit of residents and the neighbourhood.

Local councillor responsibilities fall into three main categories:

- Decision-making
- Monitoring
- Getting involved locally

Local councillors attend to local needs of residents, local groups and businesses, make decisions on local services, collaborate with district and borough councils to adhere to local needs, and progress vital projects to invest in the future of the community.

CAN I STAND FOR ELECTION?

To stand for election to a local council you must be:

- A UK or Commonwealth citizen; or be a citizen of the Republic of Ireland; or be a citizen of another Member State of the European Union
- At least 18 years old
- An elector of the local council; or in the past 12 months occupied land or other premises in the area the local council serves (as owner or tenant); or work in the area local council serves (as your principal or only place of work); or live within three miles of the local council boundary

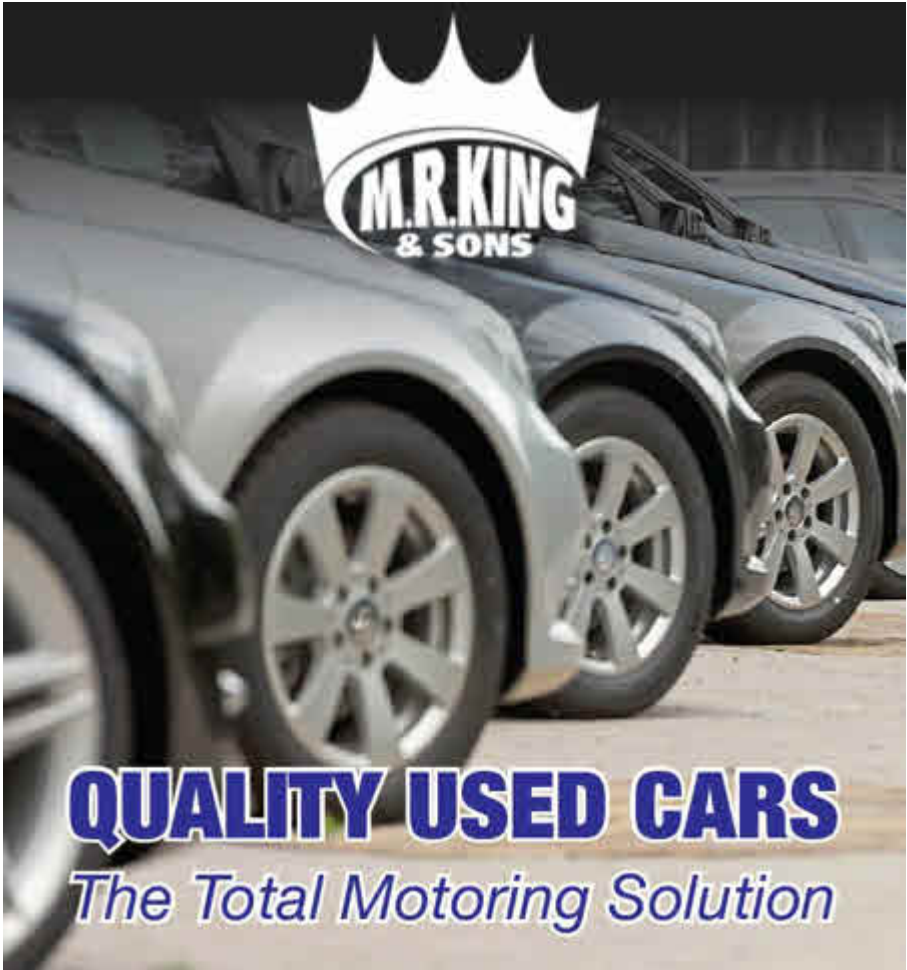
